## WHAT IS CERTIFIED ORGANIC FOOD? \_\_\_\_\_

Certified organic means that an independent certifying authority has verified that the organic standards have been met in the production and processing of food. The standards certify that the food carrying a certified label has been produced without the use of systemic pesticides, genetic engineering, hormones, irradiation, chemical fertilizer and that the animals are treated humanely. It means that farmers have been approved by a third party, follow a set of standards, pass a yearly inspection and maintain a detailed audit trail.

Organic food production is legally regulated. Currently, the European Union, the United States, Japan and many other countries require producers to obtain organic certification in order to market food as organic. In Canada, by June , 2009 the Canadian Food Inspection Agency will oversee the Canadian Organic Standards and Regulations, which must be followed by all organic producers, importers and exporters of organic food in Canada.

## BURSARY DESCRIPTION \_\_\_\_\_

This \$750 entrance bursary will be awarded to a new recipient annually. It has been established by the P.E.I. Certified Organic Producers Co-Op to encourage the pursuit of post-secondary studies in organic agriculture.

The bursary has been created due to the generous donations of artwork by Prince Edward Island Artists. These artworks are auctioned annually at our Organic Harvest Meal to sustain the education fund.

## GENERAL CRITERIA \_\_\_\_\_

This bursary is awarded annually to a student entering his/her first year of Post-Secondary studies in organic agriculture at a recognized institute of education. The recipient shall be determined by the COPC Education Fund Committee based upon the completed application form, and a minimum high school average to date (grades 10, 11 and mid-term grade 12) of 75% (or equivalent for mature students). The bursary will be transferred to the chosen recipient upon confirmation of registration with the post-secondary institution.
